

Susie and Ben's Lemonade Stand

Each cup of lemonade costs \$0.25. If Susie and Ben sold 21 cups in the first two hours, how much money did they make?

Susie spent 1 hour and 15 minutes making filters and signs for the lemonade stand. Ben and his dad spent 2 hours and 35 minutes building the stand. How long did it take to get ready for the sale altogether?

Susie and Ben sold lemonade from 3:00 pm until 6:45 pm. How much time did they spend selling lemonade?


Susie spent \$23.14 on lemons, cups, and filters. She collected \$25.00. How much money did she have left?

It took Susie 25 minutes to make filters. It took Ben 15 minutes to make lemons, cups and filters. How long did it take them to clean up altogether?









Each cup of lemonade costs \$0.25. If Susie and Ben sold 31 in the first two hours, how much money did they make? **\$7.75**


Their first customer bought 5 cups of lemonade, so the cost was \$1.25. She gave Susie a \$5 bill. How much money did she receive as change? **\$3.75**

Susie spent \$23.14 on lemons, cups and sugar for lemonade. She paid with \$25.00. How much money did she receive as change? **\$1.86**

Susie collected \$8.50 during the day and Ben collected \$5.00. How much money did they make altogether? **\$13.50**

Susie started making the lemonade at 2:35. She finished at 2:55. How long did it take her to make lemonade? 20 minutes
